Muni University signs Contract with RENU



Muni University on Friday 3rd February 2017 signed a contract with Research Education Network of Uganda (RENU) for supply and installation of last-mile Internet connectivity via fiber optic cable. The senior Procurement Officer Mr.Richard Anguyo on behalf of the Accounting

Officer welcomed the team from RENU to the University and said he was happy that finally they were putting pen to paper as this has been a long process. According to the CEO RENU Mr Isaac Masana, this has been a journey of faith to imagine that Arua could get connected to RENU. He said that the key benefit for this connectivity is that Muni University will be able to collaborate with many other universities in Uganda and other research institutions worldwide because this is a global network and Arua will become part of the National and International network through Muni University. He said they were dumbfounded by what they have seen at the university and appreciate the progress and commitment to what the university doing for the communities. is The CEO RENU was accompanied by Mr. Nicholas Mbonimpa, RENU Chief Technical Officer.

Students organize health day Campaign



The Muni University students' guild through the office of the Dean of Students organized a health day campaign event as a community outreach activity to create awareness and sensitize the community members of vital health issues. The theme for the day was "Your health, your wealth. Live a healthy life." The event that took place on Saturday 4th February 2017 was

organized in partnership with the Blood Bank Uganda and Reproductive Health Uganda (RHU).

The following activities were carried out during the event by both the students and the partnering bodies; cleaning of the environment by the general student's body that attended the event at Arua hill and later were assisted by the District Engineer who organized the garbage truck to collect the rubbish heaps that had already been collected by the students, the cleaning started right at Arua Hill and went out to town through the Police ground and to the streets of Arua town. This was closely followed by HIV /AIDS testing and counseling, family planning and

reproductive health education done by Reproductive Health Uganda and then blood donation done by Blood Bank Uganda. A number of the students led by the University Guild President HE Mr Felix Okoth donated blood.
