The breakfast meeting is an annual event organized at the university to provide a common platform for the common entities that serve as think tanks to raise issues that are very current within the region but hitched on higher education which is

the mandate of the university. This year's theme for the breakfast meeting was "Integrating refugee issues in to higher education; a common agenda".

The guest speaker at the meeting, Mr. Solomon Osakan, the Refugee Desk Officer Arua, presented a comprehensive report on status of refugees in west Nile, challenges affecting the refugees and appealed to the university management and other partners to intervene to address some of the challenges raised.
