Muni University chose to celebrate this year's bamboo day on 18th September 2020 by giving back to the community through training of the Madi Farmers Association (MADIFA) about bamboo. MADIFA had requested to be trained on bamboo and there couldn't have been a better time to do so.

They were trained in Nursery establishment and management, Bamboo value addition (various products made out of bamboo), Plantation management, Bamboo as a livelihood option in West Nile. Training was conducted by Muni University Research and MIANZI team led by directors Dr. Alumai and Isaac Kikoyo. The participants agreed to establish a team that will promote bamboo in the region through nurseries, plantations and value addition.

The 4 days training that commenced on Monday 28th Sept 2020 and ended on Thursday 1st October 2020, was aimed at equipping health workers with knowledge and skills to manage emergency cases in the clinical setting; specifically, to ensure participants use an ABCDE approach to assess the Emergency patient, they are able to identify and provide interventions for lifethreatening conditions and understand when to call

for help and when to refer a patient for higher level care of management.

The training was conducted by Dr. Jimmy Odaga-Assistant Lecturer Nursing Midwifer, Mr. Peter Nyakuni - Teaching Assistant Muni University and Mr. Jokindu Ronald-Nursing Officer Arua Regional Referral Hospital and was funded by Seed Global Health.

This follows a preceptorship training conducted by Seed Global Health on 24th and 25th September 2020 at Muni University meant to equip Arua Regional Referral Hospital Nurses involved in teaching students, with knowledge and skills for preceptorship. The hospital Nurses are expected to transmit these practical Nursing Skills to students who come for practical training at the Hospital.

According to Professor Janet Gross of Seed Global Health, in order to give standardized and effective clinical teaching, it is important to equip and empower the mentors with essential knowledge and skills to be effective clinical teachers. Preparation of clinical mentors will ensure qualified health care workers who can then assist students in the transfer of acquired knowledge to clinical practice to ensure delivery of safe, high quality effective care.
