Free COVID-19 testing for University staff

Muni University Management on 15th June organized a free Covid-19 testing for the thirty percent of staff running operations during the nationwide lockdown

This came on the heels of the Presidential directive of 6th June that has since led to the closure of schools and the suspension of non-essential travel between districts in an attempt to stem out a worrying trend in the rise in Covid-19 cases in the country. Institutions and organizations were asked to keep a 30% physical presence of staff at the workplace although this was later revised to a further reduction to 10% in non-core Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) as contained in the presidential address of June 18th.

Experts say, although the results for Covid 19 tests are confidential, it was very important exercise for the University because testing can help staff determine if they are infected with COVID-19-regardless of whether they have symptoms – and whether they are at risk of spreading the infection to others. Taking measures to prevent the spread of infection is one of the most effective strategies of fighting the

spread of the disease.

Shortly after samples were taken from staff for the Covid test, the University Vice Chancellor, Professor Christine Dranzoa urged staff to stand together and avoid stigmatization.

Stigma, she said is the social disapproval of, or discrimination against, a person based on perceivable social characteristics that serve to distinguish them from other members of a society.

Eulogy Late Acidri Stephen

(13th October 1976 - June 22nd 2021)

It is never easy to say goodbye for someone who has been a part of our lives.

When that person is gone, there is an emptiness he/she leaves in your life. That numbness of the heart is what many who knew the late Acidri Stephen felt following the news of his tragic demise on Tuesday, June 22nd 2021.

Some of you knew the late Acidri better than others but each person had a different way they experienced him and how he impacted their lives. Every supervisor and contemporary who interacted with him also had an opportunity to influence him, so a little bit of many us has gone with his untimely departure.

During such times it is therefore important to remember the good memories we all have of him so that we can focus on the good times we had together and help each other find comfort in these difficult times.

The Muni University Vice Chancellor, Professor Christine Dranzoa remembers the last Friday when the late Acidri came to campus wearing his characteristic smile. "And also, he had added some flesh. I thought, oh well this is a sign of happy marriage, good job at the University and I was truly very happy for him as he previously served on part-time basis", recalls the Vice Chancellor.

Another significant aspect, which according to the Vice Chancellor, a number of people may not have known about late Acidri was his dedicated service to the Ombaci Community who went through the untold trauma of the Ombaci massacre of 1981. "Every year he (the late Acidri) led teams to reconnect to share their stories and carry on".

n e w l y recruited University staff, especially of the November 2020 cohort, late Acidri was a true friend. He found accommodation for many of the new-comers, showed them where to eat and where to go in Arua City. "He was full of charisma and love. Always smart, a true teacher. Ever smiling and always helpful," says Associate Professor Okia Clement Akais of the Faculty of Agriculture and Environmental Sciences.

Born on 13th October 1976, the late Acidri joined Muni University in 2014 as a Part-time Assistant Lecturer of the Course Unit of Ethics and Peace Studies in the Department of Nursing in the Faculty of Health Sciences. In 2020, he was appointed full-time Assistant Lecturer in Ethics and Peace studies in the Department of Education in the Faculty of Education where he was in charge of Distance and In-service programmes where he directly coordinated the Bachelor of Education-Primary.

The Head of Department of Education, Mr Polycarp Omara describes the late Acidri as a committed and open-minded person who accomplished his tasks with minimal supervision.

Before joining Muni University, he worked with the Nile University Campus of Uganda

Martyrs University in various capacities including being the Academic Registrar.

On June 22nd 2019, he organised a memorable wedding with his beautiful wife at Holy Cross parish, Ombaci where in a few days he was also planning to baptise his child. But this has been disrupted by his death.

The University Deputy Vice Chancellor in charge of Finance and Administration, Rev Fr. Prof. Odubuker Picho Epiphany, MIDM, who matrimonised the late Acidri and his wife describes him as a God-fearing person who was committed to his work and discharged his duties quietly and calmly. "Very loving, amiable person, somebody committed to his work", says the Deputy Vice Chancellor.

He says he first got to know the late Acidri during an interview session in 2014 when he appeared for the position of part-time Lecturer.

"Just in the interview, he excelled among his competitors. The way he performed was very fascinating...above all he was a very religious person", he says.

The late Acidri holds a Master of Ethics and Public Management of Makerere University, Kampala, a Bachelor of Philosophy of Pontifical Urbaniana University, Rome, Diploma of Philosophical and Religious Studies of Queen of Apostle Philosophy Centre, Jinja, Postgraduate diploma in Teacher Education of Kyambogo University and a Certificate in Administrative Law of the Law Development Centre, Kampala. He was laid to rest at his ancestral home in Godria village, Oluffe Sub county, Maracha district, June 25th 2021. May his Soul Rest in Eternal Peace.
