Pioneer BED-Primary Students arrive on Campus

The first cohort of students for Bachelors in Education-Primary (BED-Primary) have undergone a day's orientation on studying at Muni University.

Organised by the office of the Dean of Students, the orientation was held on May 22nd at the Multi-purpose Hall and a total of 57 students had so far reported to pursue their studies. According to the Dean Faculty of Education, Dr Joyce Rebecca Bukirwa, a total of 91 students were admitted and most of them are primary teachers having diploma in Education-Primary and a few direct entrants after

successful completion of their Uganda Advanced Certificate of Education. "You can see the desire and the motivation... many are still trickling in", she said.

She said on top of the affordable fees charged by the University, many students are rushing for the course because the Faculty has competent Lecturers with experience in the mode of teaching for adult learners. The Dean of Students Ms. Amandru Stella Wawa welcomed the new students on behalf of the management and congratulated them for making it to Muni University. She said this has been a long awaited

program whose commencement was disrupted by COVID-19. She appreciated in particular the students who are also mothers for deciding to build on their career and add on their knowledge amidst all odds, and urged them to seek for help in case they are facing some challenges.

She urged the students to adhere strictly to the SOPs in place and religiously observe them as there's a new wave of COVID being reported. Subjects offered under the BED-Primary are; Mathematics, Integrated Science, Agriculture, Physical Education, Music, English, Religious Education and Social Studies. As part of the initiatives to raise the quality of teachers and teacher education in Uganda, the education ministry through the 2019 National Teacher

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Policy resolved that all teachers from preprimary should have a minimum qualification of a Bachelor's Degree.

Currently, the Grade III certificate is the minimum qualification for primary school teachers, Grade V certificate for Secondary School teachers, while Early Childhood Development-ECD teachers and Caregivers are certificate holders.

Gamis Aaron Dradi was among the 4,000 invited guests, including 11 Heads of State, Diplomats, local politicians and other dignitaries who attended the swearing in ceremony of the President of the Republic of Uganda Tibuhaburwa Yoweri Kaguta Museveni at Kololo Ceremonial Grounds will on 12th May 2021.

It is not clear whether other student leaders equally attended the function but the President in his maiden speech said because of COVID 19, only local leaders had been invited and all of them had been tested for the virus. This

The Heads of State who attended included those of Kenya, Tanzania, South Sudan, Namibia, Burundi, Zimbabwe, Guinea, Ethiopia, the Democratic Republic of Congo and Somalia. Those which sent Vice Presidents, Prime Ministers and Ministers included Gabon, Nigeria, South Africa, Sudan, Equatorial Guinea, Mozambique, Saharawi, Algeria, Russia, the United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia, Rwanda, China, Egypt, Zambia, Sri Lanka and Malawi. He was sworn in at 11.36 a.m by Chief Justice Alfonse Owiny-Dollo.

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normally write a circular", he says. He says for the purposes of quality assurance, it is a requirement that all exam questions of the University are moderated by external examiners.

He adds that exams in Muni are decentralized under the leadership of Deans and the respective Heads of Departments. "This means the administration of the exams is in their custody...for example invigilation. The office of the Academic Registrar only plays a coordination role by putting forth standard tools like attendance forms and Incidents forms", he says.
